# Developing a Forklift Train the Trainer Program

## Steps to Qualify as a Forklift Trainer

### 1 Classroom Instruction (Theory)

Trainer skills should be updated regularly.

Refresher sessions are needed when OSHA rules change or new procedures are added.

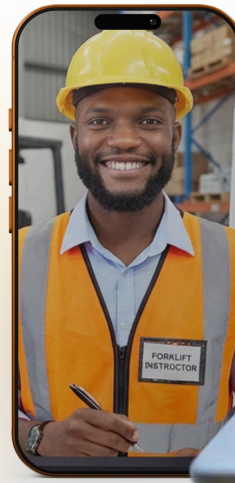
